
Excerpts from a letter from Carolin Comberti:

"When I visited Findhorn again this May, I found that the 2nd one above Bag End had been destroyed. All the stones had been thrown far away from the love well. I wondered whether someone visiting had objected to the symbol I created in the middle of the circle – that of the Jewish Star of David. I realise that this could be construed, at these troubled political times to be a controversial symbol to choose. I use this symbol, not for its connection to the Jewish faith, but for what I believe to be its original universal meaning – that of the Trinity; not the patriarchal Trinity of the Christian Church, but the original Trinity representing the Divine Marriage of Father Sky,



Mother Earth and the offspring of that Union – the Divine seed of Creation or the Christ. This I feel is a message of harmony and balance that can bring peace to all nations and honour again to the intuitive wisdom of the Divine Feminine. [...]







The LoveWells in The Park, Findhorn

The LoveWells were created by Giove di Matteo, a singer and sound healer from Tasmania who visited here in August 2005, and Carolin Comberti. Giove was told in a dream that the nature elementals and Devas were feel-



ing depleted of energy due to loud aircraft activity and due to humans in the community having reached a stage when they weren't giving regular attention any longer to making direct and conscious contact with them.



She was told that the nature spirits actually benefitted and expanded in their energy fields if we gave them our loving attention and that they longed to form a working partnership with us. They therefore recommended to Giove that three special places be created in the Park where humans could come and pour in their love and gratitude to the nature spirits, thus creating love wells where they could "bathe" and replenish themselves.



Giove was shown the spots in her dream and after exploring the Park she found the places and encouraged Carolin and others to come there regularly to keep the energy strong. They are wild spots, away from the normal well trodden paths...
